

Highway 35



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This week Tapani was busy cutting trees and continuing clearing operations. The timber coming from this area is not good, mainly comprised of bug infested or diseased trees. In addition the contractor had to deal with dead snags that that only needed a little bump to come down, a very dangerous job but when done with skilled timber fallers and the right equipment looks easy.



The photo is clearing for the new road location just west of White River Bridge. The timber in this location was salvaged root structure and all for future aquatic improvement logs.

If you were to look down river after crossing White River Bridge you might notice a large green machine working away. That machine is their mobile screening plant. Nothing more than a large sifter, a mix of rock is loaded on one end and out comes three different sizes of rock for use on the job. It's on tracks so they can move rather easily.

Out at Tamarack Quarry near Trillium Camp Ground the contractor continues their quarry safety setup. Part of that work is building a safety edge to keep vehicles from accidentally going off the road and down the hill.

Next week travelers will encounter some traffic control in the form of flagging for both tree falling and detour construction. The maximum scheduled delay is 20 minutes, but typical delays should be less. At the quarry work will continue to set up crushing operations and do exploration of what material is available and where. The quarry is now closed to public access for safety reasons.
